8:39pm *A is for Ahimsa*, Mary Donaldson: This proposal to utilize the newly-approved additional \$2000 in NSP funds will solicit art from a diverse pool of area artists on the theme of *Ahimsa* (non-violence) for an exhibit in Roselawn in September 2004.
