

**ROSELAWN COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING OF MEMBERS

SPECIAL REPORTS

CINCINNATI FIRE – reported that 87% of business inspections have been completed. Encouraged fire safety during the holidays

OTHER BUSINESS

ROSELAWN –CONDON RENOVATION - Paul Probst reported on the Roselawn-Condon renovation, as presented to the trustees by the school architects. The new plan provides a large green space, at the front of the building, that would be available for community use.

LIQUOR LICENSE REQUEST – Shell, 1900 Seymour Ave., has applied for a new C1 license. It was moved and seconded (Glas, Merrick) that we object to the issuance of the license.

COMMUNITY NEWS – Steve Kirschner noted that 3 different sites at Paddock and Seymour were in the running for the new NIOSH facility, and encouraged people to support this at the community hearing January 10.
